

2 Fields to choose from: The Spirit The Flesh



Cross-Centered Living

"See what large letters I use as I write to you with my own hand! Those who want to impress people by means of the flesh are trying to compel you to be circumcised. The only reason they do this is to avoid being persecuted for the cross of Christ.




Not even those who are circumcised keep the law, yet they want you to be circumcised that they may boast about your circumcision in the flesh. May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. Neither circumcision nor uncircumcision means anything; what counts is the new creation."



Boast: joyously exult; have high confidence in something; to be consumed by something.

Never: strongest possible word

"May I <u>never</u>, <u>no never</u>, and I mean <u>NEVER</u> boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ!!!!!!!"
