







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Serving the Residents of Timber Lake Apartments

THE PROGRAMS HAVE THREE COMPONENTS



HOMEWORK ASSISTANCE

Helping students understand and complete their homework.



ACADEMIC SKILL BUILDING

Activities designed to improve language arts and math skills.



ENRICHMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Sports, chess, art/dance class. Christian education. and other activities provide opportunities to develop decision making skills, cooperate with others and learn positive behavior.

SUMMER PROGRAMS

CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES

The Case Managers at Puente del Pueblo assist people struggling with a variety of life challenges.



Our case managers begin with a needs assessment and provide relevant information and referrals, along with advocacy to obtain services, budgeting assistance, transportation, and other appropriate assistance.

Eligibility for financial assistance from Puente del Pueblo is carefully evaluated as well. The client and case manager work to resolve current problems, as well as plan together for the household's long term stability.

ADULT LITERACY PROGRAMS

ENGLISH LITERACY Our volunteer staff teaches adult students how to speak, read, and write in English. Each tutor meets weekly with one to three students for a two-hour HITTITI language lesson. They meet at a time that fits the schedule of both the student and the volunteer tutor, with some lessons taking place in the morning, and others in the evening or on weekends. The individualized instruction allows us to serve students at many levels of English proficiency, but limits the number of openings for new students. For that reason, most English literacy students must be placed on a waiting list before they are able to join

SPANISH

LITERACY In their country of origin, many of our adult residents never had the opportunity to attend school, or learn to read and write. Puente offers free classes (students pay only for books) to those interested in learning to read and write in Spanish. Classes meet once each week for 2½ hours. Basic math, and in some cases other primary subjects, are available as well.
